### Dress code in Amida's World.

### Don't worry about clothes in my world!

When I attain Buddhahood, the humans and devas in my land will acquire garments as soon as such a desire arises in their minds, and they will naturally be clothed in fine robes as commended and prescribed by the Buddhas. If these clothes should need sewing, bleaching, dyeing or washing, may I not attain the perfect Enlightenment.

This vow illustrates our strong concerns about wearing clothing in this world. I know one minister who always wore a three-piece suit with tie every time he worked in the temple office. So I said to him, "You are a fashionable dresser, aren't you?" He replied, "Sensei, I psychologically need these when I work here; whatever I wear affects me quite a bit!" I knew that he had been spending money on suits.

My daughter has many clothes filling her bedroom and closet. She also purchases one after another. She has many pairs of shoes, too. "Dad, what do you think of this dress for a party?" I asked her "What kind of party?" "Just a party with friends," she says. Probably men would come to the party, so clothing was one of her main concerns.

One day I was watching TV news with my daughter. I said, "Look at that woman. She wears different clothes and dresses every time she appears. Probably, she spends a lot of money on clothing. Is it affordable for her to purchase many expensive dresses one after another?" My daughter looked at me strangely and said, "Dad, you don't have to worry about her clothing because her TV station gives her extra money for clothing,"

Do I need clothes in Amida's World? No, I don't because I won't have a physical body there. However, this vow helps rid myself of worry and concern about clothes before I am born in Amida's World. The vow says "Recite my name and just come to my world. Perfect Dharma-clothes are ready for you here. You don't have to dress up when you come to my world. You have nothing to worry about wearing in my world."

In other words, the vows are working on me to get rid of my worry and anxiety, one by one; these worries involve the existing details of everyday living - items such as clothes, food, items of offerings, physical appearance and strength, and so on. These vows erase my worry and anxiety before I arrive in Amida's World. In short, these vows are saying, "Don't worry about those in my world!"

I really appreciate Amida's concerns about me. Immeasurable Working already knows me before I come to know me.

## ペテン師

「ペテン師」とは、うまいこと人をだまして利益をえる者のことで、詐欺師（さぎし）のこと。私たちはよく「ペテンに引っかかった（だまされた）」と日常使う。さて、この「ペテン」の語の由来だが、人の頭は体の一番上にあるから頭のことを「てっぺん」という。この頭・頭脳を人様をだますためにさかさまに使うから「てっぺん」をひっくり返して「ぺてん」という。昔の人は中々面白いことを考え付いたものだ。

さて、あるアメリカ人が通信販売でペテンに引っかかって怒っていた。「チキンの100パーツ、10ドル」との広告に飛びつき、注文し、送られてきた商品を開けてみれば、そがなんと「100本の鶏の毛だった」という。つい笑ってしまった。その広告はウソは言っていないが、本当のことも言っていない。

では、結婚詐欺やペテンに引っかかる人はどういう人かといえば「俺様はだまされない」と思っている人なのだそう。まあ、俗にいう自信家がだまされるらしい。結婚詐欺なんて警察から連絡があって初めて「あんな良い人が俺をだますなんて信じられない」と思うらしい。うまいこと人をだますのがペテン師。

この世には「もうかる話」「おいしい話」「うまい話」がゴロゴロしている。「この株を買えばもうかります」「この化粧品を使えば美しくなります」「この薬を使えば毛がはえます」と色々ある。

ある時家内が「毛生え薬」を買ってきて私の禿げた頭にすり込んだ。しばらく続けていると「うぶ毛」みたいなものが生えてきた。シメシメと思いつけたがうぶ毛以上は生えなかった。そこで薬の能書きを注意して読んでみると「80%の人には効果がある」と書いてある。つまり私は20%の「毛がはえない部類」に入ること。

さて、だまされないためには明らかな証拠・証人があれば大丈夫のはず。ある化粧品を使ってみたら肌は綺麗になり、しわやシミが消えた。しかも使った人は全てそう成ったとすれば安心してその化粧品を使えるではないか。「確かなもの」に心を根差せば安心ではないか。聖人はそれを「仏地に根差せ」という。

雪ダルマが陽に照らされて溶けてゆくのをみた念仏者が合掌・礼拝（らいはい）していた。「あなたはどのようにして雪ダルマに手を合わせているのですか」と問うと、「私の冷たい心がミダの光に照らされて溶けて行くのと同じに感じたからです」と答えた。このような念仏の教えに生きた名もない人々の記録を読むと「この人々はただ者ではない。お釈迦様・親鸞聖人・七高僧と同じことを自分の言葉で言い表しているではないか。彼らはまさしく念仏の教えの証人ではないか」と思わずにはいられない。己の心を仏地に根づかせる。ペテン師に引っかからない。これ、命のこと。このことがどれ程大切なことか。 合掌、藤井道栄
