Formula in Buddhism The 21st Vow: Part-2

The 21st Vow

“If, when I attain Buddhahood, the humans and devas in my land should not have the **32 major physical characteristics of a great person**, may I not attain the perfect enlightenment.”

When we meditate on the figure of Amida Buddha, we concentrate on each of 32 physical characteristics. Characteristic is a result of serious practices performed by the Bodhisattva, Dharma-Kara (Amida Buddha before enlightenment). Each practice and its result illustrate the necessary practices to save all sentient beings in the 10 directions. In other words, these 32 characteristics are completed for all sentient beings. Or *Namo-Amida-Butsu* contains all the virtues of the 32 characteristics to lead us to Immeasurable Life and Light. Last month I wrote about characteristics #1 - #5; the following are #6 through #13:

6. The hands and feet are soft like cotton, and they are reddish in color.

This characteristic is a result of:

- Giving respect to Buddha and masters with such necessary items as food, drink, and bed.
- Providing good care to sick parents with a soft hand (compassion).

7. The soles of the feet are thick and soft.

This characteristic results from the hard efforts and practices engaged to seek serenity for all sentient beings.

8. The heels are round just like heels of the king of deer.

This characteristic is a result of:

- serious listening of Dharma
- sincere sharing of Dharma
- This characteristic generates joy and praise of seers.

9. The arms are long and reach lower parts of knees. The arms also hang down straight from the shoulders.

This characteristic is a result of:

- non-attachment of foods and drinks
- selfless sharing and offering of medicines
- performing non-ego deeds
- This characteristic indicates that Buddha takes away suffering and gives happiness to sentient being who are filled with ignorance and evil. This virtue means Compassion.

Monthly Salutations

Hello everyone and welcome to May! By now, we are well into the springtime and enjoying the amusing weather that Colorado has to offer at this time of year. We can expect anything from warm and sunny to cold and snowy and while these wacky changes do quite a number on allergies and energy levels, the one constant that I enjoy are the few hours of extra light that we receive. One of my little quirks is that, as long as the sun is up, I won't turn on any lights unless absolutely necessary. I find the light soothing, and when I am at home I will follow the light through the house. No matter what I am doing, I will gather up my things so that I can continue my tasks in the sunniest room. This is not to say that I won't use electricity when necessary (false light is certainly preferable to sitting around in the dark) but when I have a choice, I will always choose natural light but I find that sometimes I will go out of my way in order to bask in it. In Jodo Shinshu, we refer to light as being the Great Wisdom of Amida Buddha. In Shinran Shonin's 'Hymns of the Pure Land', he says: 'The light of wisdom exceeds all measure, and every finite living being receives this illumination that is like the dawn, so take refuge in Amida, the true and real light'. This means that all beings are embraced by this light of wisdom and because this light of wisdom exists naturally, there is no real need for us to strive, through difficult practices, to attain it. Sunny days eventually pass into dark nights and we cannot control that. But if we remind ourselves that the dark night will pass once again into the sunny day, we are comforted and so it goes with the great light of wisdom. By saying Namu Amida Butsu, we express our gratitude for having been made aware of this great wisdom and that act alone is sufficient. Of course, we can choose to chase the light, weighed down with things that we think we need in order to follow it or we can choose to remain where we are and finish our tasks uninterrupted. Either way, the light is with us and no matter how we perceive it, very bright or getting dim, the task will eventually be completed.

10. The private parts are just like a horse's and an elephant's, and are hidden.

This characteristic is a result of:

- the precept of no lechery
- saving people who committed lechery.
- protection of people who fear lechery.
- giving clothes and shoes to those who are naked.

This characteristic indicates the virtue of longevity and is the virtue which motivates people to join the Sangha.

11. The physical body is well balanced. The Buddha is tall. The shoulders are wide. The right and left sides of the body are the same size.

This characteristic is a result of:

- recommendation of concentration (not scattered mind) to sentient beings.
- sharing with non-attachment
- proper eating (not greedy eating)
- giving happiness to people with compassion
- giving medicines to people for cure
- This characteristic indicates the merit which is freed from one's physical body forever, completion of diamond-like body, the body of highest wisdom, the powerful body of pure Dharma, stability of life, unimpeded body, body of purity (no stain), the body with Dharma, and the body like a king of Dharma with nobility.

12. The body hair and the hair on the head wave clockwise. The hair is soft and shining.

This characteristic is a result of:

- encouraging and leading people to Dharma
- sharing, offering and observance of precepts
- practice of good deeds
- This characteristic works on sentient beings to generate deep joy with true benefits.

13. A single pore has one hair which has blue color like lapis lazuli. The hair gives off an unusually wonderful scent.

This characteristic is a result of:

- respect of parents, siblings, and masters
- respect of places wherever Dharma-Kara goes
- cleaning roads to get ride of thorns
- practices of good deeds, and holding the Dharma in mind
- non-tiring efforts to share the Teaching
- joy of listening of Dharma
- listening to wise people
- This characteristic indicates virtues and power which any person who is embraced with the scent and color is freed from 20-kalpa evil and blind passion.

“なも・あみだ・ぶつ” とはなにか？ 3/6.

大切な五つとは何か？それらは「誰でも（十方衆生）」「いつでも（寿命に限量なし）」「どこでも（光明に限量なし）」「名号（仏が私に与える行）」「必ず（ミダの世界に生まれる）」の五つをいう。

もう少し詳しく大切な五つの智慧・慈悲の働きを見て行きたい。これらがまさしく南無阿彌陀仏とは何かを解き明かしてくれるからである。上記の五つは南無阿彌陀仏の中身だと言える。言い換えれば、南無阿彌陀仏はこの五つから出来上がっているのである。

まず、「誰でも」とはその人の器量に関係なく、私達の抱えているもの一切を条件としないということ。私が愚者であろうと私の愚かさは法（ダルマ）のもとでは邪魔・妨げにはならない。私がいかに知識や教養があろうとも、それらは一切悟りへの助けにはならないということ。ミダ法は「私には一切の注文なし」であり「私の抱える愚かさも煩惱も妨げにはならない」ということであり、「私に清く・正しく・美しくあれ」と要求しない。むしろ「そのままの私」を示す。

大事なところですので説明を追加します。無量の働きは「男女を問わず」と顕れる。もし「男はよろしいが、女はよろしくない」となれば、女性は救いから除かれる。これでは「誰でも」とは言えないではないか。「無量の働き」とは言えないではないか。

無量の働きは「信・不信を問わず」と顕れ出る。「ミダを信じることの出来る者はよろしいが、信じられない者は浄土に生まれられない」となれば、不信の者は除かれ、しかも捨てられるではないか。これでは「誰でも」と言えない。

無量の働きは「浄・不浄を問わず」と顕れる。「心の清い者はOKだが、汚い心の者はダメだ」となれば、不浄の者は除かれ捨てられることになる。これでは「誰でも」とはならないではないか。

また無量の働きは「賢愚（けんぐ）を問わず」と顕れる。「賢い者は生まれるが、愚かしい者はよろしくない」となれば、「ミダとは無量の働き」を示すと言いながらも、愚者は除かれるではないか。愚者は置いてきぼりになり捨てられる。これでは「誰でも」とは言えない。「無量の働き（アミダ）」とは到底いえないではないか。

無量の働きが「日本人はよろしいが、中国人やアメリカ人はダメだ」となれば、中国人やアメリカ人は無視され捨てられてしまう。
